9 TO: Reduce Factory Farming

10  
11 **SECTION I:**

12 Belarus relies heavily on meat and dairy products. Industrial farming is responsible for  
13 about 37% of methane or CH<sub>4</sub> emissions that have approximately 20 times the detrimental  
14 impact of CO<sub>2</sub>. In addition to the methane by-product, manure also contains traces of salt  
15 and heavy metals that may end up in water systems and migrate up the food chain. When  
16 over applied, manure can also lead to detrimental levels of phosphorus and nitrogen in  
17 water. Many fertilizers are also made by burning fossil fuels, which may produce 41 million  
18 metric tons of CO<sub>2</sub> per year, and deforestation for agriculture and animal grazing can  
19 produce up to 2.4 billion tons of CO<sub>2</sub> per year. Not only does factory farming emit CO<sub>2</sub>  
20 and CH<sub>4</sub>, but it also releases antibiotics into the environment after feeding them to animals  
21 for growth and to prevent disease. Belarus holds about 1.5 million cows for meat and dairy  
22 products and has about 1,500 factory farms.

23 **SECTION II:**

24 A citizen out-reach program can be initiated, and fees will be placed on factory farmed  
25 foods. Volunteers will travel from schools to business settings to educate citizens on the  
26 farm of factory farming, displaying statistics and graphic images of poor animal treatment  
27 in industrial farms to steer them away from buying industrial produced meat or dairy  
28 products. We can also provide citizens with plans to make the dietary transition slightly  
29 easier. We will also provide compensation for any farmers who have lost their jobs in the  
30 process.

31 **SECTION III:**

32 Donations will be accepted, and about 0.01 % of Belarus's GDP.

34 This is not mandatory; it is opt-in.

11 **SECTION I:**

## 6 7 A RESOLUTION 8

9 TO: Hydropower to Battle Climate Change in Lowland Countries

### 10 11 SECTION I:

12 Now that the sea levels have risen since 2022 as well as a severe increase in  
13 temperatures, especially in Kuwait, a solution needs to be quickly planned. Due to Kuwait's  
14 population residing mostly in the urban, lowland coastal areas which are located at about  
15 0ft above sea level, Kuwait would be facing a refugee crisis on an extensive scale, as well  
16 as many other lowland countries who have the majority of their populations in low areas.  
17 The temperatures would also increase by 40 degrees fahrenheit in Kuwait, and during the  
18 summer months it already averages around a staggering 113 degrees fahrenheit during  
19 the day.  
20

### 21 SECTION II:

22 An effective solution to all of these problems would be to construct a series of  
23 hydroelectric dams around Kuwait's coast as well as other lowland countries. These dams  
24 could also be used to help with the scorching temperatures, and air conditioning units  
25 could be placed in communal areas as well as in all buildings that do not already have them.  
26 We would be producing clean energy, cooling down overheated areas, and saving the  
27 economies of many different countries.  
28  
29

### 30 SECTION III:

31 This does come at a costly price, however. Every country who chooses to be part of this  
32 plan will have to donate about 0.2% of their GDP to this resolution.  
33

### 34 SECTION IV:

35 The UN will oversee the construction of the dams and make sure that the money being  
36 donated to participating countries will be used effectively and will be used on the  
37 construction of hydroelectric dams as well as air conditioning units or possibly extra  
38 construction to help deal with the increasing temperatures. This is also an opt-in, but it is  
39 still very highly encouraged that countries participate in this resolution plan.  
40 Penalties of 0.2% of a country's GDP as well as an additional \$60,000,000 will be needed  
41 in order to help compensate for countries that decide to use the money in nefarious ways.

## 7 A RESOLUTION

8  
9 TO: Cool the Earth through a Protection-Incentivized Dusting Coalition

### 10 SECTION I:

11 Given the droughts, sea level rises, and increased temperatures worldwide, which Israel  
12 was hit especially hard by, drastic measures are needed to 1. Cool the planet and 2. Solve  
13 the drought issue and its famines. Because Earth is essentially too far gone to save in  
14 terms of species extinction and flooding, Israel proposes a strong solution to cool the  
15 planet at all costs: a coalition where countries who join will contribute to Israel's plan in  
16 exchange for certain benefits.

17 The solution is increasing the amount of dust in the atmosphere to cool the planet. High-  
18 iron dust, especially from deserts, creates an effect similar to a shade on the Earth by  
19 reflecting sunlight, and also serves to stimulate rain by giving it particles to coalesce  
20 around in the atmosphere. Think of how Saharan dust causes rains and storms in the  
21 Atlantic. While this dust may have severe ecological repercussions, it is more important to  
22 save people right now from dying to hunger and thirst, as the world is already irreparably  
23 scarred environmentally.

### 24 SECTION II:

25  
26 An opt-in program will be created where member countries will work to increase the  
27 amount of dust that is blown from their country in exchange for benefits. It has three  
28 stipulations:

29 Member countries must alter their geography to support dust release.

30 This can be accomplished by flattening arid terrain in the country and eliminating  
31 grasslands that hold down soil. It is actually more feasible than it seems on paper, as  
32 shown by the Dust Bowl in the 1930s.

33  
34 Israel will provide members with Iron Dome missile defense systems and technological  
35 assistance for protection.

36 The world is currently very unstable and wracked with innumerable internal problems, so  
37 Israel, being an advanced nation, will help protect member countries from other renegade  
38 nations who resort to violence. This is extremely valuable in a time of unprecedented global  
39 unrest.

40  
41 Member countries must support Israel's claim to and accept its coming takeover of the  
42 West Bank and Gaza Strip, as well as all of Jerusalem.  
43

1 Much of Israel's east coast is flooded, and Israel must take over the contested Palestinian  
2 territory to survive.

3

4 SECTION III:

5 Kuwait has already accepted these terms, showing that previous religious and political  
6 divides are less important than the survival of the human race. They prioritized safety  
7 (protection from attacks from Iraq) as well as prosperity (more rains and cooler  
8 temperatures) over qualms they previously had about Israel.

9

10 Countries will provide for their own dusting, but Israel will subsidize 15% each member's  
11 efforts from its own GDP. Israel will also finance the creation and installation of the Iron  
12 Dome defense systems.

13 SECTION IV:

14 Israel will withdraw its support from countries who violate any of the three terms  
15 mentioned above. Israel's UN delegation will determine if the countries are participating to

## 6 A RESOLUTION

7  
8 TO: Save Humanity from Extinction

### 9 10 SECTION I:

11 Scientists estimate that the effects of climate change could be irreparable as soon as 2027 if  
12 nothing substantial is done. On the current course the world is taking, it is not unlikely that we  
13 will reach this point. When we reach a point in time where climate change is irreversible, we plan  
14 to have a spaceship which we will take 2000 people on to escape the Earth. The passenger's

### 18 SECTION II:

25 countries. There will be an on-board farm and livestock area for food, and we will have a water  
26 supply system. The logistics of how these systems will operate and how the ship will run will be  
27 decided by a team of top scientists that will be created with the passing of this resolution.  
28 Australia will be the main decision maker in this project. The project is expected to be finished by  
29 2035 if it begins in 2023.

### 30 SECTION III:

31 We do not have an accurate estimate on how much the project will cost, but it could be anywhere  
32 from 4 to 8 hundred billion dollars. It will require rapid funding at a high rate, but everything will  
33 work out once the participating countries fund the project. Once a country opts in, they must  
34 send workers and scientists to Australia in addition to a certain amount of money. The amount of  
35 money will be a percentage of their GDP. The percentage will be determined when we have a good  
36 estimate on how much the project will cost.

### 37 SECTION IV:

38 There will be no penalties for a lack of participation as this is an opt-in program. Countries who  
39 have opted in and do not supply the correct amount of funds or workers to construct the ship will  
40 be penalized. If their subpar participation continues, they will be removed from the program.

9 TO: Cure Depression with Koalas

10  
11 **SECTION I:**

24 **SECTION III:**
