8 TO: Return to the City State
9 SECTION I:

10 City states are in the pasts of many civilizations, including perhaps most famously the
11 Maya, Mesopotamia, and Greece. In times of conflict, centralized governments often split
12 into separate states, as with the Warring States Period in China, the fall of the empire of
13 Alexander the Great, and more recently, the temporary fragmentation of the Congo during
14 the Congo crisis. All of these examples revolved around the collapse of a central
15 government in the face of a crisis, and often involved military rule. Unlike these other
16 examples, Singapore is a successful city state whose power is not rooted in its military.
17 The key difference is that it separated from both the British Empire and Malaysia on
18 peaceful and well-negotiated terms. As the world prepares for a crisis unlike anything we
19 have experienced before, we must take these historical examples into account to ensure
20 the best possible outcome.

21 SECTION II:

22 The UN will advise all cities, provinces, and states that wish to have its help in becoming
23 sovereign. In order to safely carry out the impending fall of centralized governments that
24 often accompanies a crisis, the UN will seize the opportunity to help new city-states
25 implement the necessities for self-government before they are forced to do so by a fallen
26 federal government or violent altercations. Not only will this help to prevent the violent
27 civil wars seen during government collapses, this will also be better overall for people in a
28 crisis-ridden world. Local governments often have closer ties to the people, and will
29 understand the specific problems faced by their community in an international crisis. Once
30 established, these newly-formed city-state countries will then have the opportunity to join
31 the UN in the already-established method, as any country would.

32 SECTION III:

33 Individual states, provinces, and cities will fund most of the necessary changes to their
34 governing systems, infrastructure, etc, with guidance from the UN. The UN Central
35 Emergency Response Fund (CERF) will apportion funds to those developing city-states that
36 request further financial aid through decisions made by the general assembly.

37 SECTION IV:

38 It is understandable that countries may not wish to allow decentralization; it is, after all, a
39 decrease in their power. The UN will work to help negotiate separations, but will impose
40 economic sanctions against countries that do not allow cities, states, provinces,
41 municipalities, etc. to self-govern despite peaceful and fair negotiations overseen by the
42 UN.

9 TO: Observe and React

11 SECTION I:

12 Throughout history the biggest adversities have been overcome through groups of
13 determined countries coming together to triumph. Spain and Australia would like to begin a
14 coalition for exactly this purpose.

16 SECTION II:

17 To begin, Spain and Australia, along with any other collaborating countries, propose the
18 establishment of the United Nations Language Department. This department of the UN
19 would gather the world's leading language experts together in an attempt to communicate

9 TO: To Ensuring the Survival of the Human Race

11 SECTION I:

12 As Japan, we are concerned with the safety of the world considering the possible global

11 **SECTION I:**

12 With regards to the rise of an aforementioned secret organization, it is essential to find
