<b>TO:</b>	Create Universal Strategy to Vet and Provide Asylum to Refugees While Controlling their borders
<b>SECTION I:</b>	Deeply conscious of the issues caused by mass, unorganized immigration China desires increased cooperation between national intelligence agencies to make accepting of refugees safer for everyone involved.
<b>SECTION II:</b>	China calls upon the the UN to ask a portion of nations' GDP for the facilitation of cooperation between intelligence agencies. Any funds left over would be used for 6 months to aid countries who have taken in a large amount of refugees. After six months the security council would reevaluate this. A universal application for refugees would be created and countries who opt-in can take in refugees on their own terms. A country will be banned from the program if they abuse their priveleges to the program.
<b>SECTION III:</b>	A portion of the GDP of nations wanting to opt in would be determined by economic experts assigned by the security council.
<b>SECTION IV:</b>	This is an opt-in resolution. To use the resources a country must opt-in. No penalties for not opting-in.

<b>TO:</b>	Establish Mobile Opioid Treatment Centers
<b>SECTION I:</b>	Seeing that the opioid epidemic is an issue which exists across both impoverished and developed states, this resolution proposes to address the larger, unrecognized difficulty of curbing abuse in rural areas; however, this issue is not solely limited to these areas
<b>SECTION II:</b>	In order to address the concern of opioid abuse, the United Nations shall send vehicles outfitted with the capabilities to exchange needles, distribute treatments, and educate in reducing the prevalence of opioid drugs. These vehicles will be staffed by volunteers and medical professionals with experience in administration of narcotic treatments and education. The number of vehicles per country will be proportional to a state's reported population of opioid users.
<b>SECTION III:</b>	The program will be opt-in with each country contributing .02% of their annual GNI to a secure contribution pool.
<b>SECTION IV:</b>	No penalties exist in relation to this resolution

<b>TO:</b>	Create Cradle Orphanages in Affected Countries
<b>SECTION I:</b>	The goal of this proposal is to help limit infanticide and sex-selective abortions by providing citizens with a haven for women to anonymously give up their child to the orphanage
<b>SECTION II:</b>	Public-private partnerships will be created in order provide orphanage-focused charities with the funds to create these orphanages. Background checks will be performed prior to giving funding in order to ensure efficient use of funds. Cradle orphanages will be built in places as determined by the United Nations Eco/Soc council. An annual report will be sent to the UN council for review for each orphanage which will examine the quality of care, the allocation of funds, and population growth of the orphanage.
<b>SECTION III:</b>	Funding in the UN Women's Organization and UNICEF will go towards creating and maintaining these orphanages. Donations will also be accepted from individuals and private donors.
<b>SECTION IV:</b>	This opt-in program has no penalties for the countries. Should a charity or specific orphanage be found to improperly allocate funds and/or poorly run facilities, funding will be retracted by the UN.

<b>TOPIC:</b>	GA - Global Opioid Crisis
<b>A RESOLUTION</b>	
<b>TO:</b>	Provide financial relief to countries that need more rehabilitation centers to provide a safe space for those addicted to deadly opioids.
<b>SECTION I:</b>	Countries that experience a high rate of opioid addiction and drug related crimes will be able to opt-in for a program that assists in the lowering of the crime and death rates.
<b>SECTION II:</b>	This program is opt-in for countries who have experienced an extreme opioid crisis. This program also gives money to countries that are in need of new rehabilitation/research centers, and to increase the funds offered to increase the education of doctors in order to lower the misuse of medical opioids which usually leads to addictions. The countries that opt in are required to practice at least 3 non-opioid medications before using opioids (last resort).
<b>SECTION III:</b>	The big five countries of Security Council will be mandated to provide aid and in return they will be helping to keep the same deadly drugs from entering their countries. Countries with a nominal GDP equal to or above 300 billion USD and a GDP per capita equal to or above \$25,000 USD will be encouraged to opt in. Over the course of recovery, the nations being aided will pay back a portion of the aid sent via medical supplies, as well as paying the teachers sent by aiding countries, thus providing a small return as an incentive for nations to opt in, and nations over \$300 billion are no longer forced to opt in, merely encouraged.

<b>TOPIC:</b>	Security - Isis and Security in the Middle East
<b>A RESOLUTION</b>	
<b>TO:</b>	Guidelines for Military intervention in the Middle East
<b>SECTION I:</b>	Acknowledging the problems presented by the escalation of military activity in the Middle East, China believes that countries should work together to curb foreign military intervention in the region.
<b>SECTION II:</b>	China accepts that many countries have both economic and political interests in the Syria; however, China also believes that military intervention should not be the first plan of action. China declares accordingly that, from the passage of this resolution forward, all "boots on the ground" military intervention should be reviewed and passed by the UN security council. Countries may donate air support, naval support, military oversight, and training to the UN for peacekeeper training of local forces.
<b>SECTION III:</b>	There is no funding necessary; however, countries that desiring to contribute military support in the Middle East must do so through the U.N. except for those in the middle east
<b>SECTION IV:</b>	Any nation violating would be condemned for their actions of intervention and sanctions would be considered by the security council.
