9 TO: Nuke 'Em All

10 11 **SECTION I:**

12 This resolution aims to nuke the alien spacecraft in Antarctica. We will then do our best to
13 communicate to the other ships to leave; if they do not do so within one rotation of the
14 sun, we nuke them too. The first bombing is to act as a threat, while further acts of
15 violence will only come out of necessity.

16 **SECTION II:**

17 Bombing the one landed ship will only serve as an example to the others. We will broadcast
18 it to the other ships that are currently hovering in the atmosphere. If they fail to leave or
19 make contact about their purpose on earth, nukes will be sent to those ships too. If the
20 aliens communicate to us peacefully, then the second round of bombs will be held until they

22 superior military power to us, then we could always communicate that bombing is a simple
23 gesture of friendliness on our planet and we end up learning more about the aliens'
24 capabilities anyway. Countries that opt-in get a place in the decision-making after the
25 initial nuke is sent. Countries that opt-in with this plan can also supply specialty nukes or
26 bombs. Once the spaceships are destroyed, bragging rights and recovered materials will be
27 given out proportional to who aids the most with the environmental cleanup.

28 **SECTION III:**

29 We already have the nukes, so no funds will be needed for this plan except in the case of
30 restoring any damages caused by the destruction of the spacecraft. Damage control efforts
31 will be handled by opted-in countries and NGOs specializing in environmental conservation.

32 **SECTION IV:**

33 There is no penalty for not opting in.

9 TO: Empower Children Against Sexual Exploitation

10
11 **SECTION I:**

12 According to the UN Children’s Fund, 10% of girls under the age of 20 have been forced to
13 engage in sex or perform other sexual acts, globally. This amounts to over 120 million
14 individuals, and does not include the millions of boys who never mentioned their abuse for
15 fear of stigma or reprisals. All over the world, governments are updating their laws and
16 policies to more effectively criminalize child sexual abuse and exploitation, yet many
17 countries still fall behind. It is the responsibility of the United Nations to establish a
18 comprehensive legal framework and strategies to protect children from sexual abuse, and
19 the first step to this is the creation of empowering, inclusive and safe environments in
20 which children can have access to sexual education and reporting mechanisms.

21 **SECTION II:**

22 Children themselves are the most important factor in combating this issue. Under this
23 program, a council will be created as a subsidiary of the UNICEF agency that will send UN
24 representatives to countries that choose to participate. These representatives will work
25 with local educators, taking into account the unique needs and considerations of each
26 region, to create specialized methods of educating children on sex and sexual exploitation.
27 Examples of this include education that supports children’s sense of body ownership and
28 gives them the skills required to recognize and respond to confusing or potentially
29 dangerous situations.

30
31 **SECTION III:**

32 This program will be funded through guaranteed grants given to each opt-in country from
33 the existing UNICEF budget.

35 **SECTION IV:**

36 This program is opt-in and requires no penalties.

7 A RESOLUTION

9 TO: Mastermind and Weaponize 100 FLDSMDFRs (The Flint Lockwood Diatonic Super
10 Mutating Dynamic Food Replicator) to demolish the Invasive Alien Spaceships
11

12 SECTION I:

13 Deeply conscious of the urgency regarding this alien invasion, the United States believes
14 there is only one solution to this crisis: the FLDSMDFRs. You've seen them in Cloudy with a
15 Chance of Meatballs, but now they're going to be used in an entirely different capacity - to
16 shoot at and bury the alien spaceships in piles of food so high they will all become

18 SECTION II:

19 The United States calls upon all member countries to mobilize their advanced technicians
20 and scientists to replicate these machines. Once created, the FLDSMDFRs will be launched
21 into orbit, where they will be directed towards all the alien spaceships. They will be
22 launched by a Board of Space Taskforce (Conveniently abbreviated as BS), consisting of the
23 top professionals of all the Space Agencies including our very own NASA Space Center. At
24 the command of the task force, they will proceed to spew out gargantuan amounts of food
25 at the locations of the alien spaceships. Once the alien threat has been eliminated, the
26 United States will personally fund the maintenance of all FLDSMDFRs and FLDSMDFR waste

29 SECTION III:

30 The funding for the launch of the FLDSMDFRs will come from the United States' allocated
31 funds towards NASA and their 22.6 billion dollar budget. However, if any country wishes to
32 donate materials towards production, the United States will gladly accept and is willing to
33 set up an aid package to be determined after the alien threat.

34 SECTION IV:

35 This is an opt-in resolution so no penalties are necessary. However, we heavily encourage
36 countries with advanced technicians and scientists to help and replicate these FLDSMDFRs.

9 TO: Save Humanity: A Detailed Plan

10 11 **SECTION I:**

12 This crisis is an extraordinarily complex problem, with limited information. Therefore, it
13 calls for a complex solution, with many possible conclusions. This matter is incredibly
14 sensitive and should be handled as such. The safety of humanity is the number one priority,
15 which is why there must be an emphasis on peaceful contact with the aliens. However, we
16 do not deny the possibility that our visitors may mean us harm. Provocation will be
17 avoided at all costs, but this does not mean that humanity is left defenseless. Far from it;
18 this resolution delineates plans for the survival of human race and for a counterattack to
19 save lives. This resolution calls for a united front of countries against what may turn out to
20 be the greatest threat humanity has ever faced.

21 **SECTION II:**

22 **Subset I: Establishing Peaceful Contact**

23
24 **Communication:** Emphasis will be laid on establishing communication of ideas, until there is
25 provocation or another reason to abandon peaceful options. Tele-communications will be
26 used when possible, to limit the number of affronts that could occur. It is of the utmost
27 importance to discover the aliens' motive without causing aggression. Further decisions will
28 be made by UN councils created after further information is gathered.

31 **Subset II: Preparing for Hostile Contact**

32
33 **Weapons Contingency:** To prepare for the contingency of hostile aliens, a panel of
34 scientists nominated by individual countries will attempt to gather information on the alien
35 ships from afar and develop adequate weapons that could work against these alien ships.
36 To avoid miscommunications, no humans or human probes will approach the ships.

37
38 **Project BUNKR:** Additionally, it is of the utmost importance in the case of hostile conflict
39 that humanity survives. Being aware of this, this resolution will initiate Project Build
40 Underground Network Key Response, aka Project B.U.N.K.R. Fully stocked underground
41 bunkers will be created in several classified locations. Five members of each country in the
42 United Nations will be nominated and selected for the program by their respective
43 governments. It is up to the individual governments to produce their candidates. Speed and

1 secrecy are of the utmost importance in this project, and the people who physically create
2 and are therefore aware of the location of these bunkers will be included in the population.
3 Retrieval: To avoid detection by the aliens, there will be no communication between the
4 bunkers and the rest of humanity. For every bunker, there will be one designated person on
5 the surface who is aware of the location and population of that one bunker. When the
6 Secretary-General declares the state of emergency has ended, the population from the
7 bunkers will be retrieved. In an extreme case, after 5 years, the population in the bunker
8 will leave at their own discretion if they have not already been retrieved.

11 Subset III: After Hostile Contact

12 This resolution also seeks to create a general idea for attack in case of a threat by the
13 aliens. A war council, detailed at a later date, will be created to coordinate attacks against
14 the invaders. Forces will attempt to take control of the ships, to both further our
15 understanding of technologies and weaknesses and to gain control of a possible weapon
16 against other ships. As more information becomes clear, plans will become more detailed.

19 Amendments Clause

20 This resolution acknowledges that this is a delicate situation, and many parts of this
21 resolution may need to be changed as further knowledge increases. As more information is
22 gained about our extraterrestrial visitors, modifications are welcome and encouraged.

24 SECTION III:

25 Money from the Central Emergency Response Fund (CERF) will be used to fund military
26 efforts, research, and bunker construction and stocking. If needed, later on, money may be
27 drawn from each country's GDP to fund life-saving efforts.

28 SECTION IV:

29 This is a mandatory program. Countries which do not participate or engage in attacks
30 outside of those approved by a later council or detailed in this plan will be placed under
31 heavy sanctions by the United Nations after the crisis has ended. That is, assuming that
32 the defection of said country does not lead to the destruction of humanity.

9 TO: Implement an International Firewall

10
11 **SECTION I:**

12 It has been well-established that the aliens who have begun occupying our globe have
13 excellent technology, even superior technology. They were able to enter our atmosphere

15 on the defensive and take protective measures, especially technologically. We need to keep

27 this resolution pertains to. Contributions (both monetary and intellectual) from individual
28 nations are encouraged.

29 **SECTION IV:**

30 Any nation who does not participate will be seen as a traitor to mankind because they are
31 putting our information at risk of exposure willingly.

9 TO: The "Dance Draft": Establish Peace Through Choreography

10 SECTION I:

11 A mysterious SO (space object) has slid into DMs (domestic municipalities) across the
12 world. As the world's only universal organization, it is our responsibility to uphold global
13 safety when managing our communications with this unknown entity. We must approach

16 SECTION II:
